SCRIPTURAL REFERENCES (42x in 38v)

(Mat 8:28) "And when he was come to the other side into the country of the Gergesenes, there met him two possessed with devils, coming out of the **tombs**, exceeding fierce, so that no man might pass by that way."

(Mat 23:29) "Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! because ye build the **tombs** of the prophets, and garnish the **sepulchres** of the righteous,"

(Mat 27:52-53) "And the **graves** were opened; and many **bodies** of the saints which slept **arose**, {53} And came out of the **graves** after his **resurrection**, and went into the holy city, and **appeared** unto many."

(Mat 27:60) "And laid it in his own new **tomb**, which he had hewn out in the rock: and he rolled a great stone to the door of the **sepulchre**, and departed."

(Mat 28:8) "And they departed **quickly** from the **sepulchre** with fear and great joy; and did run to bring his disciples word."

(Mark 5:2-3) "And when he was come out of the ship, **immediately** there met him out of the **tombs** a man with an unclean spirit, {3} Who had *his* dwelling among the **tombs**; and no man could bind him, no, not with chains:"

(Mark 6:29) "And when his disciples heard *of it*, they came and took up his **corpse**, and laid it in a **tomb**."

(Mark 15:46) "And he bought fine linen, and took him down, and wrapped him in the linen, and laid him in a **sepulchre** which was hewn out of a rock, and rolled a stone unto the door of the **sepulchre**."

(Mark 16:2-3) "And very early in the morning the first *day* of the week, they came unto the **sepulchre** at the rising of the sun. {3} And they said among themselves, Who shall roll us away the stone from the door of the **sepulchre**?"

(Mark 16:5) "And entering into the **sepulchre**, they saw a young man sitting on the right side, clothed in a long white garment; and they were affrighted."

(Mark 16:8) "And they went out **quickly**, and fled from the **sepulchre**; for they trembled and were amazed: neither said they any thing to any *man*; for they were afraid."

(Luke 11:44) "Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! for ye are as **graves** which appear not, and the men that walk over *them* are not aware *of them*."

(Luke 11:47-48) "Woe unto you! for ye build the **sepulchres** of the prophets, and your fathers **killed** them. {48} Truly ye bear witness that ye allow the deeds of your fathers: for they indeed **killed** them, and ye build their **sepulchres**."

(Luke 23:55) "And the women also, which came with him from Galilee, followed after, and beheld the **sepulchre**, and how his **body** was laid."

(Luke 24:2) "And they found the stone rolled away from the **sepulchre**."

(Luke 24:9) "And returned from the **sepulchre**, and told all these things unto the eleven, and to all the rest."

(Luke 24:12) "Then arose Peter, and ran unto the **sepulchre**; and stooping down, he beheld the linen clothes laid by themselves, and departed, wondering in himself at that which was come to pass."

(Luke 24:22) "Yea, and certain women also of our company made us astonished, which were early at the **sepulchre**;"

(Luke 24:24) "And certain of them which were with us went to the **sepulchre**, and found *it* even so as the women had said: but him they saw not."

(John 5:28) "Marvel not at this: for **the hour is coming**, in the which all that are in the **graves** shall hear his voice,"

(John 11:17) "Then when Jesus came, he found that he had *lain* in the **grave four days** already."

(John 11:31) "The Jews then which were with her in the house, and comforted her, when they saw Mary, that she rose up **hastily** and went out, followed her, saying, She goeth unto the **grave** to weep there."

(John 11:38) "Jesus therefore again groaning in himself cometh to the **grave**. It was a cave, and a stone lay upon it."

(John 12:17) "The people therefore that was with him when he called Lazarus out of his **grave**, and **raised him from the dead**, bare record."

(John 19:41-42) "Now in the place where he was crucified there was a garden; and in the garden a new **sepulchre**, wherein was never man yet laid. {42} There laid they Jesus therefore because of the Jews' preparation *day*; for the **sepulchre** was **nigh at hand**."

(John 20:1-4) "**The first day of the week** cometh Mary Magdalene early, when it was yet dark, unto the **sepulchre**, and seeth the stone taken away from the **sepulchre**. {2} Then she runneth, and cometh to Simon Peter, and to the other disciple, whom Jesus loved, and saith unto them, They have taken away the Lord out of the **sepulchre**, and we know not where they have laid him. {3} Peter therefore went forth, and that other disciple, and came to the **sepulchre**. {4} So they ran both together: and the other disciple did outrun Peter, and came first to the **sepulchre**."

(John 20:6) "Then cometh Simon Peter following him, and went into the **sepulchre**, and seeth the linen clothes lie,"

(John 20:8) "Then went in also that other disciple, which came first to the **sepulchre**, and he saw, and believed."

(John 20:11) "But Mary stood without at the **sepulchre** weeping: and as she wept, she stooped down, *and looked* into the **sepulchre**,"

(Acts 13:29) "And when they had fulfilled all that was written of him, they took *him* down from the tree, and laid *him* in a **sepulchre**."
